



Date Celebrated	Legal Basis Proclamation No. 700, Series of 2014 Republic Act No. 9003 – Ecological Solid Waste Management Act of 2000	Brief Description of the Event or Celebration
February 2	Ramcar Convention in Welland,	This is an annual celebration of the vital importance of international wetlands to ecological and human health. It marks the date of the adoption of the Convention on Wetlands on 2 February 1971, in the Iranian city of Ramsar on the shores of the Caspian Sea. Government agencies, non-government organizations and community groups have celebrated World Wetlands Day by undertaking actions to raise public awareness of wetland values and benefits and promote the conservation and wise use of wetlands. These activities include seminars, nature walks, festivals, launches of new policies, announcement of new Ramsar sites, newspaper articles, radio interviews and wetland rehabilitation.
March 3	United Nations General Assembly Cited Paragraph 20, 2013	This resolution, the General Assembly reaffirmed the intrinsic value of wildlife and its various contributions, including ecological, cultural, socio-economic, scientific, educational, cultural, recreational and aesthetic. To sustainably developmen, and human well-being, and recognized the importance of Convention on International Trade in Endangered Species of Wild Fauna and Flora (CITES) in ensuring that international trade does not threaten the species' survival.
March 20	United Nations General Assembly Cited Paragraph 20, 2013	The resolution is intended to be one of the world's leading global platforms for people with an interest in forests and climate change to share their views and work together to ensure forests are fully incorporated into any future climate change mitigation and adaptation strategies.
March 22/ 4th Week of March	1992 United Nations Conference on Environment and Development (UNCED) in Rio de Janeiro	This world day for water was proposed starting in 1993, in conformity with the recommendations of the United Nations Conference on Environment and Development proclaimed in Chapter 16 (Fresh Water Resources) of Agenda 21.
May 22/ April	Presidential Proclamation No. 1431 and 2482	Earth Day Network was founded on the premise that all people, regardless of race, gender, income, or geography, have a moral right to a healthy, sustainable environment. Our mission is to broaden and diversify the environmental movement worldwide, and to mobilize it as the most effective vehicle for protecting a healthy, sustainable environment. We pursue our mission through a combination of education, public policy, and consumer activism. Our campaign and programs are predicated on the belief that an educated, energized population will take action to secure a healthy future for itself and its children. Earth Day Network has a global reach with a network of more than 17,500 partners and organizations in 174 countries. More than 1 billion people participate in Earth Day activities, making it the largest secular civic event in the world.
May 22	Presidential Proclamation No. 57, Series of 1999	Proclamation No. 57 dated January 9, 1999 declares the Month of May as the Month of the Ocean in the Philippines. The United Nations proclaimed May 22 as International Day for Biological Diversity to increase understanding and appreciation of biodiversity issues.

Date Declaratory J. n/a	Legal Basis Presidentia Proclamation No. 237	Brief Description of the Event or Celebration World Environment Day (WED) is held bi-annually by the UN General Assembly in 1972 to mark the opening of the Stockholm Conference on the Human Environment.
June 5-10	Proclamation No. 79	Global Environment Day (WED) is held bi-annually by the UN General Assembly in 1972 to mark the opening of the Stockholm Conference on the Human Environment.
June 17	95' United Nations Convention to Combat Desertification Cordoba	In 1994, the United Nations General Assembly declared June 17 the "World Day to Combat Desertification and Drought." To promote public awareness of the issue, one day implementation of the United Nations Convention to Combat Desertification (UNCCD) in those countries experiencing desertification through joint government, non-governmental organizations and all other interested parties to participate in the annual celebration of the "Philippines Earth Week."
July	Presidential Proclamation No. 623 (last cleanup) F-clarification No. 396 of June 2, 2003	The "Clean-up" is held for most governmental agencies, including government-owned and controlled corporations, private sector, schools, civil society groups, and population in time preceding July.
September 3rd Weekend of Suspension	Executive Order No. 127 dated August 10, 1995	National Disaster Consciousness Month aimed to increase awareness of everyone's role to the ever-threatening disasters for a better appreciation of the government's disaster preparedness program.
September 15	Presidentiel Proclamation No. 245 - National Clean-up Month Presidentiel Proclamation No. 420 Interministr Circular Clean-up Weekend	This event was just the beginning of a movement for cleaner beaches and marine habitats. In a few years, what had been a local clean-up grew to encompass the 50 U.S. states and, after US, In 1989, the Clean-up the World weekend officially became an international event, with the involvement of representatives of Canada and Mexico. Today, half a million citizens from almost 100 countries participate in the Clean-up, and it has grown to an annual event, involving people the world over to get outside and do something for their coastal environment.
October 20- 25	2012 International Conference on Cadmium Management	The Montreal Protocol on Substances that Deplete the Ozone Layer came into force on 1 January 1989 when it had been ratified by 29 countries and the European Economic Community (EEC). As of February 2012, 191 countries have ratified the "Protocol," representing an international effort to safeguard the ozone layer through controls on production, consumption and use of ozone-depleting substances (ODS). Under said Protocol, all government entities, agencies and industrial facilities in the whole field of health are urged to implement activities geared toward the conservation of the Marawi and its habitats at least during the month of October.
